<u>Asylee Status</u> - a person who has been allowed to remain in the U.S. after seeking asylum. An asylee may apply for adjustment of status to that of a permanent resident after one year.

<u>Student Visa Status</u> - a person who has been admitted to the U.S. to participate in a program of academic or vocational study at a specified educational institution. These persons travel to the U.S. under either an F-1 (academic) or M-1 (vocational) visa.
